Titre: BSM Interpretations of the 12.5-year NANOGrav Pulsar Timing

Résumé: The NANOGrav pulsar timing collaboration has recently reported strong evidence for a new stochastic common-spectrum process affecting the pulsar timing residuals in its 12.5-year data set. If confirmed in the future, this signal may turn out to be the first glimpse of a stochastic gravitationalwave background at nanohertz frequencies. In the first half of this talk, I will review the NANOGrav experiment, discuss the properties of the observed signal, and comment on its astrophysical interpretation in terms of inspiraling supermassive black-hole binaries. In the second half of the talk, I will then turn to possible explanations based on physics beyond the standard model, including first-order phase transitions, primordial black holes, and cosmic strings. I will conclude by giving an outlook on the future of gravitationalwave astronomy in general and pulsar timing measurements in particular in view of the NANOGrav result. My own work on the NANOGrav signal is contained in 2009.06607 and 2009.10649, which I will also briefly discuss.
